We support disadvantaged children in Kigali, Rwanda, transform their lives through the love for football.

Our training program, led by professional football players and certified coaches, fosters their talents, instil positive values, and provide a nurturing environment for growth, both on and off the field.

FLFA in numbers: 400 children including 40 girls guided by 8 coaches train at least 2 times per week in 2 different locations

# Our Story

Future Light Football Academy, was founded in April 2023 by Eric Iracyadukunda and Bram Vlaanderen.

## 2023

The year began with a spark of passion on the field - 100 enthusiastic kids joined our program, led by Coach Eric. Every Sunday, for 2 hours, the team trained together, building skills, confidence, and friendships.

## 2024

Our community grew stronger and more diverse. Participation soared, welcoming girls and introducing our first female coach. With 3 dedicated coaches guiding the sessions, we celebrated the year's accomplishments with a festive Christmas party, bringing everyone together to reflect on their achievements.

## 2025

The program continues to expand! We added a second location, join various local competitions and welcome close to 400 kids every week accross trainings and locations. With 6 committed coaches on board, we are stronger than ever, providing more opportunities for kids to play, learn, and thrive.

## About the founders



Eric is a professional football player with Bugesera FC in Rwanda and a dedicated children's coach. He feels fortunate to have his dream career and uses his free time to improve lives through football.



Bram is a lawyer originally from the Netherlands and living in Dubai. He draws inspiration from the strong sense of community in Kigali and proudly partners with Eric as a co-founder of Future Light.

# Core Program

Future Light Football Academy offers each player our **core** activities.



## Trainings twice per week

We have two locations where we train twice a week. They come from all over Kigali to play and be part of the biggest football team in the city.

## Coaching, nutrition and equipment

The success of training relies on the spirit of trainers and players, along with essentials like footballs, bibs, water, and nutritious food such as bananas, and for refueling.

## Competition

FLFA participates in local football competitions. Players are selected based on effort and merit for teams representing FLFA in four age groups from 8 to 18.



# Ongoing Initiatives

## Partnerships

FLFA partners with other non-profits where we can complement each other. Examples include AFRIPads, providing girl players with sustainable hygiene products, and GIYA for youth leadership education.

## Girl Participation

Sports participation is often still considered a boys activity. We don't believe. Some of our most dedicated players are girls! They make up about **10% of players**, a number we are proud of but are keen to increase to **50%**. FLFA has a **female coach** and caters to girls' needs with focused trainings and sports bras.

## School attendance

Families of some of our players do not have the means for school fees and uniforms. We provide such support, monitoring attendance and results.

## Growth

The academy started with a Sunday morning training in a single location (Nyamirambo). We opened a second location (Gahanga) and offer at least two trainings a week to close to **400 players** under supervision of **8 coaches**.

We intend to keep growing as much as resources allow.

## Coach Certification

All **coaches are certified** in accordance with the African football certification system **CAF**.

As we care for our players, we want our coaches to develop professionally as well.

## Skills Training

In addition to trainings we offer our players to learn skills such as leadership training, IT training and musical practice and dance.





# Financial Transparency



## Dual Foundation Structure

- **Netherlands Foundation:** Receives, distributes, and audits funds for effective use. (Stichting Future Light Football Academy, Chamber of Commerce registration 96943750 / RSIN 86784412, board: Bram Vlaanderen, Max Barendregt, Jonne Buijtels)
- **Rwanda Foundation:** Ensures compliance with local regulations on child protection, governance, and fund use.

## Regulatory Compliance

- Rwandan law requires that at least 80% of funds must be spent directly on the mission (max. 20% overhead).
- 100% of funds used for mission activities to date.

## Use of Funds (2024)

- **25%** → Equipment
- **60%** → Nutrition
- **15%** → Coaches (certifications, transport reimbursement)

## Source of funds

- Occasional donation and founders have founded FLFA since inception

## Forward Outlook

- Equipment & nutrition costs to decrease (economies of scale, partnerships).
- Coaching costs to increase (professionalisation, salaries).

## Reporting & Transparency

- Public reporting to be published on our website.
- Donors receive dedicated financial and impact reports.
